Inclusion/Belonging

- Handprint banner/collage
- Daily Say Hi challenges
- “Hello My Name is...” Name Badges
- Sit with others at lunch
- “Find someone who...”
- “Getting to know you...” questions
- Pen Pal exchange
- Promote “hi” in different languages

Diversity

- Chart the different languages spoken at your school
- Learn “Hi” in different languages – study the country of origin, teach others
- Say hi in different languages on announcements
- “Say Hi” word find
- Create a video of people saying hi in different languages
- Match the Hi’s to the country of origin
- Students wear labels with Hi in different languages – that’s how they say hi all day
- Post hellos in different languages on bulletin board

Bullying Prevention

- “Gotcha” rewards (get caught saying hi)
- Buddy up students
- Say Hi passports
- Perform skits and songs
- Most outrageous group activities (MOGA)
- Icebreaker activities

Citizenship Development/Community Awareness

- Write letters to seniors, community helpers
- Say Hi to a neighbouring school
- Students to greet peers at doors
- Create a student “Say Hi” patrol
- Invite dignitaries/celebrities to Say Hi
- Hold a school-wide picnic
- Pen pals with another school
- Put a “Say Hi” message on outdoor sign

Spirit Day

- Wear black and yellow
- Create a school “Say Hi” banner
- Greeters at doors
- Create a Say Hi cheer
- Do a school “Wave”
- School wide photo
- Face painting
- Chalk it Up: write Hi in chalk outside
