#### 1. Expand Reach through Understanding and Engagement

#### 2. Social Media Committee:

- 1-day parent conference will be held in November, lead by the school board, supported by the committee
- Committee is planning a Speaker Series for parents throughout November
- **3.** Hold the Date: The Justice Dinner is scheduled for Thursday, May 26, 2016 at Bingemans in Kitchener. The overarching message of "Everyone Matters" will explore issues related to mental health which was identified as a major concern in the CPC strategic plan consultation. Our keynotes speakers will be **Dr. Lori Triano-Antidormi, Dr. John Heintzman** and **Justice Hearn**.

**4. MP Raj Saini** responded to the invitation to meet with the WRCPC and visited with staff at the Governor's house for an extended dialogue on crime prevention through social development. Mr. Saini is very interested in supporting the Council both locally and in Ottawa and is hoping to attend meetings of the council as the opportunities arise. He also became a Friend of Crime Prevention.



### 2. Base Change in Good Evidence and Innovation

1. Educational Events about Intimate Partner Violence (IPV): WRCPC is a member of the Health Engagement Task Force (of the Domestic Assault Review Team, DART) which seeks to increase awareness of and screening for intimate partner violence. An educational event was held in partnership with Conestoga College at the Doon campus on February 11<sup>th</sup> for 250 students in health and security related programs. Three Friends of Crime Prevention volunteered at the WRCPC booth through-out the day (pictured below). WRCPC staff provided an introductory overview of domestic violence statistics and served as a panelist for the afternoon session. 
